We value opportunities to reach new audiences, and have worked with several organizations in the past fiscal year to achieve shared goals. Here is some of our selected work:


Alma Mater Society of UBC Vancouver: Through a partnership, BOLT Safety provided the AMS with consulting services and conducted programming on UBC campus to improve safety and equity standards. We were part of the sexual violence policy review process for both the AMS and the University of British Columbia, presented personal safety resources and raised awareness to the student body through both in-person booths and workshops, and onboarded both the AMS Food Bank and the AMS Sexual Assault Support Centre as Safe Hubs partners. Through this partnership with the AMS, we were also able to formally launch our Project LyghtNyng workshop program in the Nest.

5X Fest: Our Executive Director, Vedanshi, was invited to be a 5X Patron to support their organization's endeavours to support South Asian creatives. Our relationship with 5X Fest continued at their signature Blockparty in June, where Safe Buddies were on-site to foster a safe experience for all attendees, and provide risk-management services.

Ted Baker generously supported our advocacy for safer and equitable communities by styling our Executive Director, Vedanshi, for events where she represents our organization.

ICONNBC Business Association invited us to meet Premier David Eby, Members of the Legislative Assembly, and BC Government Ministers as part of a delegation to Victoria. Our Executive Director, Vedanshi, and Operations Director, Shreyanshi, represented us at these meetings.

OVERVIEW

The Marketing Committee serves to promote BOLT Safety's initiatives on various media platforms and through in-person outreach events in the community. This year, BOLT Safety has made further advances internationally with our debut at the United Nations. We aim to further advance BOLT Safety's global presence in the time to come.

Our responsibilities include publishing official statements on behalf of BOLT Safety and both online and offline outreach so that our resources can be more widely found. A notable example of our efforts to raise awareness on topics pertaining to human rights, in the context of ending violence, is our 'Case Files' series, which was featured on Instagram Reels and YouTube Shorts.

BOLT Safety is extremely honoured for the opportunities and support that we have received in the past year to amplify our impact through our media partners. Digital Platform

Our Digital Platform is available on the WIX mobile app, or accessed via web browsers on any device (e.g. phones, computers).

At the core of our Digital Platform, The Hub serves as an digital educational space to share survivor-centric narratives, self-defense tips, safety resources, as well as relevant news commentary. Our team of researchers, writers, and graphic designers collaborate on informative and digestible content for viewers while exploring new forms of engagement. This past fiscal year social media campaigns and collaboration with companies have helped to increase our article viewership. For instance, we partnered with L'Oréal Paris to include their #StandUp Against Street Harassment training on our Digital Platform.

We also covered a diverse range of topics and article styles in the eight articles we published this past fiscal year. We expanded our list of legal resources for victims of stalking, domestic abuse, violence, and sexual assault. Our article *Stalking: Taking Legal Action*, specifically outlines the legal process to take against one's stalker according to Canadian law. Another article, *Intimate Partner Violence Against Men*, provided statistics on the often undercovered topic of men's safety. In 2023 we also began expanding our list of international safety resources, starting with India.

This past year has brought numerous achievements, and the Hub aspires to continue increasing engagement and viewership as we expand our impact to communities internationally.





Safe Hubs

Safe Hubs brings together the local community to provide a network of safe spaces and crisis management resources. This year, our program grew to 21 Safe Hub partners, including the office of Coquitlam Member of Parliament, Ms. Bonita Zarrillo.

In this fiscal year, we brought Safe Hubs to new cities through mobile team outreach events, and we are pleased to report that 8 cities now have a partner safe space. Our partners, For The Menstruator, have been an invaluable ally in connecting donors of menstrual hygiene products for us to both donate to community organizations and causes, and make available for disbursement through our Safe Hubs partner locations. In the year to come, we hope to continue building new relationships for our program to scale the impact it can have.



Safe Buddies

The Safe Buddies program is dedicated to ensuring that everyone feels safe within their respective communities.

Our approach revolves around connecting clients with our trained volunteers who can provide accompaniment on the phone and in-person. Recognizing the need for greater impact, we have shifted our model from individual client requests to partnering with event organizers. This strategic move has allowed us to reach a wider audience, raising awareness and fostering a stronger sense of community safety.

Having maintained close ties with UBC's Alma Mater Society through a partnership, we have been able to connect with campus event organizers and recruit passionate Safe Buddies volunteers, amplifying our impact on safety on campus, and beyond. For instance, we provided coverage at the UBC Fraternities and Sororities' ACF event. More notably, Safe Buddies played a pivotal role in the 5X Fest Blockparty, the largest event we have engaged in yet, with a remarkable attendance of 3,000 people. By offering support and a dependable presence during such milestone celebrations, we aim to ensure that guests are able to enjoy a special event while feeling safe and protected.

As we reflect on the achievements of the past year, we express our deepest gratitude to our dedicated volunteers, community partners, and generous supporters. With their unwavering commitment, Safe Buddies, driven by BOLT Safety, continues to champion safety and security for society's most vulnerable.



Project LyghtNyng

Project LyghtNyng is a newly launched program which presents a series of workshops regarding topics such as violence prevention, flipping the victim-blaming narrative, and consent. Our goal is to remove stigma surrounding said topics in the hope of creating a safer and more equitable community.

During the 2022-23 fiscal year, we were able to deliver 12 workshops with each workshop being catered specifically towards our attendees. Our workshops were delivered online as well as in-person to participants who were as young as 14.

During this year, we were also able to successfully launch Project LyghtNyng officially with around 70 attendees at the in-person launch event. Moving forward, the Project LyghtNyng team hopes to deliver more impactful workshops and build our clientele.
